Temporalities encompass the ways in which time is experienced, perceived, and understood as a dynamic structure shaping existence. The plural form, "temporalities," emphasizes the coexistence of multiple, often contradictory concepts of time, influenced by diverse values, political and religious beliefs, as well as economic and technological frameworks. Latin America serves as a striking example. Here, indigenous and (post)colonial time regimes, revolutionary futures and historical continuities, global rhythms and local temporalities, to name but a few, have been in constant negotiation.

We welcome contributions from all disciplines with the aim of exploring temporalities through projections into the future, memory practices, and everyday experiences, highlighting time as both a lived and socially constructed reality.
